Reply from Beckfoot School

Thank you for your email.

I became Headteacher of Beckfoot in September 2019 having spent 4 years as Headteacher of Beckfoot Upper Heaton. This is a school I know well having been Deputy Headteacher here previously and knowing the school since 2002. Over the years we have worked hard to build a school that the local community can be proud of and our relationships with all stakeholders are very important to us.

We are very proud of our school and our students but we also know that there is, at times, a minority who do not always uphold our values. We always, as you allude to, aim to do all we can to prevent these instances through our daily work with students, our PSHCE programme and our clear messages about what it is to be a member of our school community and a part of a wider community in this part of Bradford and beyond. Fundamentally, it is about being decent and considerate to others at all times.

We act very quickly to support the local community whenever incidents are brought to our attention and will always continue to do so I can assure. We are not perfect, nor are our students at times, but will always do whatever it takes to be better.

In terms of Idling, we held a meeting here yesterday with WYP, the NPT, Planning and the Council to look at this issue and speeding for that matter. We have held campaigns led by students and supported by our NPT the last of which was in the Autumn term and that work was featured in the T&A. This is important to us and whilst we have limited powers we are trying to better educate our parents, carers and students as to the dangers of idling, speed and road safety. This work is ongoing but we are being supported by all the relevant and necessary people in order to attempt to bring about change and make Bradford Road a safer place.

Lastly, should you ever wish for me to come to council to talk to members directly it would be my pleasure and I would do my utmost to make timings fit with my commitments.

Reply from Bingley Grammar School

Thank you for your email. I would be interested to hear the response of the Chief Superintendent for West Yorkshire police with regard to anti-social behaviour in the town centre as it will allow us to make a co-ordinated response.

With regard to engine idling, our communications officer Mrs Kennett has been putting regular messages about the parking issue and engine idling on our website and our social media pages (twitter and facebook) and also in our monthly newsletter and magazine. The student group tasked with creating posters and banners for this were overwhelmed with their workload at that time of the year. They did however use their voice at events such as awards evening and transition events to speak directly with parent/carers about the issue. We have been in contact with Kate Questa at Bradford Council to ask for help with resources such as banners but the 'We Care About Clean Air' campaign they have rolled out across Bradford is specifically aimed at Primary Schools and they are not appropriate graphics for our students and their parent/carers.

With regards to parking in general around our school grounds, we are regularly in contact with parking services asking for their support.

Reply from Bingley Library

The Library service has had to employ a security guard to protect users of the Library for the last few years. This at a high cost to the service. We report any incidents to the Police on a regular basis.

The previous managers of the Library had meetings with the Youth Services and Police to try and work together to deter the ASB taking place within the shopping complex.

Contact was also made to the schools in the area to ask for their support for the library service and dealing with their students' behaviour whilst they are in uniform.

We would welcome any support.

We notify the Police of any incidents, but I have been made aware that names of the offenders are not known. There are other services/shops within the precinct who have issues with these people.
