## Minutes of the Full Council meeting of Bingley Town Council held on Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> September 2024 at 6.30pm at Bingley Baptist Church, Clyde Street, Bingley

## Meeting commenced at 6.30pm.

## 2425/100 Chair's remarks

Noted the following remarks from the Councillor Gentleman, the Chair of the meeting:

- Summer is officially over, as we move into autumn; let's hope that it is a mild winter for all pensioners who have lost their winter fuel allowance.
- There are still plenty of activities happening in Bingley: free tai chi lessons in Prince of Wales Park this Saturday, also Bingley Creates will be at Damart Café offering pottery etc.; on Sunday there is 'My Kinda Music' in Cottingley Town Hall at 2pm; on Monday Bingley Camera Club will be giving a talk at Bingley United Reform Church; on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> October, there will be a 'Willow Weaving' event at Jerr Wood; and on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> October the Town Council will be hosting the next community networking event at Cardigan House, Ferncliffe Road, Bingley, from 10am to 12pm.

2425/106 Representation from Bradford City of Culture 2025 team

Item deferred to a future meeting.

Councillor Shaw entered the meeting at 6.42pm.

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**2425/107** Representation from Bradford Council's Highways Winter Maintenance Team
Paul Naylor from Bradford Council's Highways Winter Maintenance Team provided an update on the scheme this year, answering questions from councillors and highlighting the following:

- Worked well with the Town Council last year to highlight local areas that required attention, including the footbridge at Britannia Street; please can the Town Council and residents continue to inform the team/Bradford Council Ward Councillors if there are any highways related issues.
- As well as winter maintenance (gritting etc.), the team are also responsible for the winter cleansing operation.
- A challenge for the team this year is the closure of two depots, which means that Ilkley jobs
  now run from Keighley, and Queensbury jobs now run from Bradford; although this impacts on
  cleansing predominantly, the depots are used for gritting also so the team will only be working
  from only two depots going forward. However, it is hoped that there will be improvements in
  other areas, such as a possible electric gritter and setting up a salt mine for use on the highways
  (as featured on the BBC News).
- The footpath service around the town centres will still be in place this year; the team work in conjunction with Bradford Council's Parks Department to spread salt in Bingley Mr Naylor to send the footpath gritting route plan onto the Town Council, and to investigate the gritter that is still stored in Myrtle Park (as reported by Councillor Goode).
- As well as the gritting operation, the team clear gullies and there are three gully wagons assessing the Bradford area, including the Ireland Bridge area in Bingley; the team are also aware of the broken gully at Castlefields, Bingley, which needs further investigation by the gully maintenance team. There are 100,000 gullies in the Bradford area and six gully operatives therefore, again, please can the Town Council and residents continue to report any gully issues to Bradford Council (via Bradford Council's general enquiries number 01274 431000 or via the online reporting tool <a href="https://www.bradford.gov.uk/transport-and-travel/report-issues/report-blocked-gullies-and-drains/">https://www.bradford.gov.uk/transport-and-travel/report-issues/report-blocked-gullies-and-drains/</a>) and the team will aim to respond within 21 days.
- It was reported that there is overgrown vegetation on the Keighley bound slip road onto the bypass: Mr Naylor to highlight this to the cleansing department.

The Town Council thanked Mr Naylor for his attendance at the meeting; he left the meeting at 6.58pm.

## 2425/108 Representation from Bradford Council Ward Councillors

Councillor Winnard reported the following updates from Bradford Council:

- There are new arrangements for Bradford Council's bulk waste collection service following a review: collections are now only going to be carried out at weekends and residents need to book a slot with the Council (either ring or book online), at a cost of £50 for 3 items.
- Dangerous parking at schools has been highlighted again, with two recent incidents in
  Cottingley near the primary school, particularly parking on footpaths: the health and safety of
  the children is paramount here. It was reported that the blocking of driveways is also a major
  problem in Cottingley near the schools, as well as problem parking on Bradford Old Road and
  grass verges by Dixons Cottingley Academy. Councillor Winnard agreed to feed back these
  issues to Bradford Council Wardens to agree a workable solution.
- Another common issue raised is the profusion of weeds/vegetation on footpaths and the sides of roads; an outside contractor is now being used, who spray each of the wards three times per summer, however some roads have been omitted. At the Council Executive next week there will be a debate regarding the use of weedkiller, including the use of glyphosphate.

## 2425/109 Parking permit charges proposal

**Resolved** to agree that Councillors Carney and Heseltine to put together a letter to Bradford Council outlining the concerns of the Town Council regarding the implementation of parking permits for residents/visitors parking in specific areas, highlighting the following:

- This will be detrimental to disabled residents, as well as any elderly residents who do not have access to the internet to secure these permits.
- Some areas where the parking permits were introduced to alleviate problem parking (e.g. Poplar House, due to the former Bradford and Bingley Building Society workers) are no longer necessary.
- In some areas where parking permits were introduced, residents were not consulted initially on these plans: to suggest that Bradford Council should consult residents on whether they feel their parking scheme is still relevant, and if not, it should be revoked for that area (i.e. the scheme needs to be reviewed).
- Enforcement, e.g. parking wardens, need to be in situ in necessary areas to enforce these permits where needed (e.g. near Bingley Grammar School).

## 2425/110 Ongoing items

## 2425/116 Events, Marketing and Communications Committee (EMACC)

Noted the following update from Councillor Goode from the recent EMACC meeting:

- The newly purchased app. facilitated by the website host, Cuttlefish, is working well.
- The Chairman of Bingley Chamber of Trade attended the meeting to provide an update on the Christmas switch on event: this will take place on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> November, and they will be applying for a grant from the Town Council for 50% of the total costs; it is the last Christmas event that the Secretary will be undertaking therefore this may need to be taken on by the Town Council from next year.
- Regular meetings, chaired by Bradford Council Ward Councillor Fricker, continue to be held to
  plan for the City of Culture celebrations next year, and lots of community groups are already
  part of a large programme for Bingley, for the festival 'Bingley 2025' to be held on the early May
  bank holiday weekend (3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> May). This event will be themed, with the Saturday being
  based on heritage, the Sunday celebrating crafts and music, and the Monday focusing on
  activities, including 'Myrtle Mayhem', the skateboarding competition, and will hopefully also
  involve local sports groups.
- Councillor Carney is working as a member of the Bingley Remembrance Group to make plans for the VE Day celebration on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> May next year.
- Liaising with Bradford Council regarding running an extended series of music events in Myrtle Park bandstand next year, every Sunday from 1<sup>st</sup> June to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2025. These will be in conjunction with the Friends of Myrtle Park and Bingley Music Town, who will agree the dates they would like the bandstand for their music events, and then Bradford Council can fill the empty slots.
- The first stage of the riverside walk project has been completed, with the refurbishing of the path and painting of railings, by volunteers from Aire River Trust (ART) and Bradford Council's Rights of Way department. There will be another meeting held with ART with a view to improving it further, which may be a project for next year.

#### 2425/117 Finance and General Purposes (F&GP) Committee

Noted the following update from the recent F&GP Committee meeting:

- Allotments:
  - The shed has now been dismantled on plot 5, Beck Lane; recommendation that £1,170 is transferred from the Allotment Reserve to cover this cost.
  - Apple tree on plot 6, Beck Lane, needs a crown lift; awaiting confirmation from Bradford Council whether planning permission is needed to do this.
  - Autumn clearing day at Beck Lane on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> October, where a skip will be ordered to help plot holders dispose of debris etc.; Councillors Carney, Fenton, Goode and Heseltine to attend to help out and strongly requested further councillor volunteers for this day.
- Grant: Friends of Prince of Wales Park were granted funding to contribute towards the cost of pre-project expenses to regenerate the park/treacherous pathways, which are blocking up the drains, etc., subject to the group gaining relevant permission from Bradford Council.
- Green and Clean:
  - Next litter pick taking place this Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> September, meeting at Britannia Street near the canal bridge, at 10am Councillors Carney and Drucquer to attend to allow Councillor Goode to absent himself for some of the time; also agreed with Bingley Remembrance Group that a leaf and litter pick to take place prior to the Remembrance Day event on Sunday 10th November, to meet at Bingley Arts Centre at 8am.
  - Councillor Goode and the Town Clerk have undertaken a thorough assessment of all the planters in the parish, with a view to compiling a tender for the planting and watering contracts.

 Hub: Bradford Council's Youth Café requested to use the Hub as a venue due to the café shutting down, however the committee decided against this due to logistics/potential costs etc., however it was agreed to write to Bradford Council with concerns regarding the closure of the Youth Café.

**Resolved** to agree to transfer £1,170 from the Allotment Reserve to cover the cost of the dismantling of the shed.

Councillor Malik left the meeting at 7.38pm.
